

- We promote British values including Democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance for those who are of a different background or faith.


British Values

School council

We have a smileys and stars behaviour system to show us that every action has a consequence




Every class has their own classroom rules that pupils understand are there to keep us all safe and allow learning to take place successfully.







It doesn't mean you can do whatever you want - it means you are free to do what's right.








INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY

We are able to choose which clubs we would like to join based on our own interests whether this is sport, art, computing.




INDIVIDUAL LIBERTY AT KOPS

MUTUAL RESPECT


What is mutual respect?

It means having respect for others and treating them as you would want to be treated yourself. Respecting the thoughts and feelings of others even if you may not agree with everything they say and in return they should respect you.





Pupils are encouraged to use our school behaviour principles of Ready, Respectful, Safe to ensure we show respect to everyone.



Pupils work together in pairs (learning partners) or groups during lessons respectully listening to each other and taking on board ideas from each other.
